# Construction Corner

Even though the terminal project has not officially kicked off, the airport has many other construction projects in process. One of our exciting projects currently underway is the Sbarro Restaurant Renovations. The restaurants under



renovation are in the pre-security area of Terminal A and the post-security area of Terminal B. The Terminal A location will be converted to a post-security restaurant. The \$400,000 job is expected to take about six weeks. During that time, temporary food kiosks will be set up to serve passengers. Gateway Grill and Wine Bar will replace the two existing Sbarro restaurants with new eateries that feature local fare. The menu at Gateway Grill and Wine Bar will include freshly prepared items and a variety of local products, including Hoffman hotdogs, Gianelli sausages, and Dinosaur BBQ food.

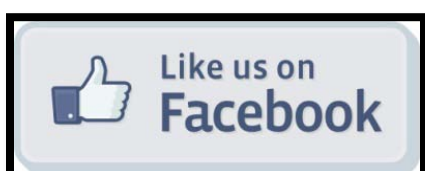
