Chair Gagliano started the SRAA Board meeting at 11:34 a.m. after the Board took a tour of the baggage claim areas.

Roll Call

As noted above, all SRAA Board members were present in person other than Mr. Kenneth Kinsey, Mr. Michael Mirizio and Mr. Thomas Fernandez.

Consent Agenda:

Chair Gagliano referenced minutes of the Regular Board meeting held on December 5, 2025, and asked for any changes or comments to either. Hearing no objections, Chair Gagliano invited a motion to

approve. A motion was made by Mr. Lazar, seconded by Dr. DeSiato, and the consent agenda was unanimously approved.

The resolution was adopted: 8 ayes, 0 nays, 0 abstain

Airport Management Report:

Executive Director Terreri introduced the Operations and Maintenance teams and commended them for doing such a great job during this difficult snow season along with our hard-working Custodial team. He went on to provide a preview of the 2025 SRAA Annual Report highlights and presented the year end numbers. Each year, SRAA employees and management vote on the Employee of the Year. Director Terreri announced that Airport Maintenance Worker, Alejandro De LaPaz was voted to be the SRAA employee of the year and presented him with an award. This is well-earned as he has been given high praise by his peers and supervisors as indicated by the quotes about him that will be listed inside the Annual report booklet.

New Business/Discussion:

Executive Director Terreri and CFO Watkins gave an update regarding the status of the new subsidiary, Altitude Access Solutions, Inc. (AAS), which will begin July 1st to take over the parking operations at SYR. The necessary job titles, policies, procedures and By-laws were discussed and per the NYS ABO and Enabling Legislative requirements, the AAS Board will mirror the SRAA Board membership. Two AAS Committees will also be required, Audit and Governance. Those committees will also have the same members as the current SRAA committees for each. CFO Watkins shared the most recent financial presentation.

A reminder that The State of the Airport presentation will be held at the OnCenter on Friday, February 6, 2026 beginning at 8:00 a.m. was announced. Nearly 200 local community and legislative members will be in attendance.

Executive Session

Chair Gagliano invited a motion to go into executive session to discuss matters pertaining to (1) pending/current litigation in the Northern District of New York, *Megan Thomas Law, PLLC v. SRAA* (NDNY 5:25-CV-01114); and (2) the financial, credit, and/or employment history of particular corporations. Motion was made by Dr. DeSiato and seconded by Mr. Stevens. Motion was unanimously approved. Executive session began at 12:45 p.m. and ended at 1:25 p.m. No action was taken.

RESOLUTION CREATING THE POSITION OF FACILITIES TECHNICIAN

WHEREAS, the Syracuse Regional Airport Authority (the “Authority”) is a public benefit corporation, formed and operating pursuant to Chapter 463 of the Laws of New York 2011 and Article 8, Title 34 of the New York Public Authorities Law, as amended (the “Enabling Act”); and

WHEREAS, Section 2799-ggg (12) of the Enabling Act authorizes the Authority to appoint such officers, employees and agents as the Authority may require for the performance of its duties, and to fix and determine their qualifications, duties and compensation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority desires to create the position of “Facilities Technician”, which position involves performing a broad range of basic maintenance, repair, and facility support services within the Airport terminal and associated Airport properties, including, but not limited to: routine facility upkeep and minor, non-technical, maintenance activities (non-specialized or trade-specific craft work); assisting with straightforward tasks related to electrical, roofing, masonry, or locksmith work (at a basic or support capacity); operating standard tools or equipment for simple tasks that do not require advanced planning, layout, or precision workmanship; assessing minor maintenance needs; identifying basic repair requirements; and providing rough cost estimates for small, routine tasks; and

WHEREAS, the creation of this position is a necessary step required by the Onondaga County Personnel Department and the New York State Civil Service Commission; and

WHEREAS, the New York State and Local Employees’ Retirement System requires certain specific language be included in such resolutions concerning the title of new positions being created and the standard workday for such new positions;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of the Syracuse Regional Airport Authority, location code 51482, hereby creates the following position with the following as standard workdays for such position and will report days worked to the New York State and Local Employees' Retirement System based on the time keeping system or the record of activities maintained and submitted by these members to the clerk of this body:

FACILITIES TECHNICIAN (Exempt)

DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS

The work involves performing a broad range of basic maintenance, repair, and facility support tasks within the Syracuse Hancock International Airport terminal and associated airport properties. Duties emphasize general upkeep and practical, hands-on problem solving rather than specialized or trade-specific craft work.

Employees in this class are responsible for routine facility upkeep and minor, non technical maintenance activities.

A Facilities Technician may assist with straightforward tasks related to electrical, roofing, masonry, or locksmith work, but only at a basic, or support capacity. The position may also operate standard tools or equipment for simple tasks that do not require advanced planning, layout, or precision workmanship.

Employees occasionally assess minor maintenance needs, identify basic repair requirements, or provide rough cost estimates for small, routine tasks. These assignments do not involve complex project evaluation or specialized knowledge of materials or trade practices.

Work instructions may be provided verbally, electronically, or in writing, and may include simple sketches. Employees have flexibility in choosing practical methods to complete assigned tasks. This position reports to an administrative supervisor. Supervisory responsibilities are not typically assigned. Performs related duties as required.

TYPICAL WORK ACTIVITIES

- Repairs doors, window sash, storm windows, screens, window guards, locks and other door hardware, stairs, and railings; erects and moves partitions; assists in cutting, fitting, assembling, repairing, and erecting wooden objects and structures.
- Assembles, repairs, and installs wood, plastic and metal furniture and fixtures such as office chairs, wheelchairs, desks, cabinets, bookcases and modifies furniture by adding bumpers, padding or special protective devices to meet special needs of user.
- Performs basic plumbing tasks, including locating and clearing stoppages, repairing minor leaks, and identifying and shutting off water lines.

- Operates and performs routine maintenance on heating and hot water equipment including the replacement of parts such as filters; replaces or adjusts such components as thermostats and points.
- Points up brick and stonework; patches plaster walls, sets tile; lays brick or stone on a repair basis; replaces firebrick on a repair basis.
- Assists in repair and overhaul of air conditioning and refrigeration equipment utilizing methods of the HVAC trades.
- Overhauls locks and door checks; makes keys; installs locks and other door and window hardware; changes combinations on pin tumbler locks; and opens locks when keys are not available.
- Hand mixes plaster or cement and finishes concrete work or makes repairs by patching; may assist in the operation of a concrete mixer; may operate a concrete block machine.
- Does interior and exterior painting not requiring fine finish or decorative treatment, or assists a journey level employee in projects requiring high quality; applies primer and finishing coat using brush or spray gun; may paint vehicles and equipment; may do wall papering and spray painting.
- Repairs electrical equipment such as vacuum cleaners, fans, overhead door motors or other equipment with small motors.
- Authorized to reset a tripped circuit breaker once, only when an overload is verified as the cause and no energized components above 50 volts are exposed.
- Repairs and maintains floor cleaning equipment, including preventative maintenance, basic maintenance repairs, and diagnostics to determine if contract maintenance is required
- Repairs and rebuilds metal, slate, shingle, membrane, and built-up roofs.
- Installs hinges, shelf brackets, sash chains, door handles and other hardware fixtures as needed; installs carpets, carpet tiles and drapes, drapery rods and fixtures; cuts carpet to install, repair or patch; repairs Formica, replaces ceiling tiles, floor tiles or vinyl flooring; applies or replaces grout.
- Cuts glass and replaces broken panes; and applies weatherization materials.
- Repairs broken appliances which do not require major overhaul.
- Loads and unloads materials as needed and cleans tools upon completion of projects.
- May operate shop machinery as needed to assemble such items as bookcases, tables, boxes, screens, doors and racks.
- May be required to maintain simple records which relate to maintenance or repair.
- Utilize electronic work order system
- May perform mechanical tasks such as making simple parts as needed by drilling, tapping, threading, cutting and grinding.

- May operate motor vehicles and power-driven equipment when required.
- May perform building cleaning and grounds keeping work such as snow removal, sanding, salting.
- May perform fence repair
- May operate and perform routine maintenance on heating, ventilating, and hot water equipment including the replacement of such parts as belts, sheaves, grease fittings, filters, and pumps.
- Must be able to work evening, weekends and holidays due to 24/7 operations
- Other duties as assigned

FULL PERFORMANCE KNOWLEDGES, SKILL, ABILITIES AND PERSONAL CHARACTERISTICS

- Working knowledge of FAR 139 and Part 1542
- Good knowledge of standard tools, materials, methods and practices of various trade and craft areas
- Good knowledge of the occupational hazards and safety precautions of the work
- Strong analytical and problem-solving skills
- Ability to interpret plans and specifications with instructions
- Ability to understand and follow oral and written instructions and to interpret work from rough sketches
- Ability to make rough estimates for time and material requirements
- Ability to develop skill in the use and care of tools, materials and equipment of various trade and craft areas
- Able to perform calmly during high stress situations
- Ability to work independently and prioritize tasks, meeting set deadlines
- Ability to work professionally and respectfully with a diverse group of staff, including colleagues, management, and tenants
- Ability to safely operate a motor vehicle or other mechanical machinery as required for the position
- Ability to utilize technology systems for maintenance recordkeeping
- Physical condition commensurate with the demands of the position, which may include but is not limited to lifting and carrying up to 75 lbs., standing and walking for extended periods of time, bending and stooping, flexibility for tight spaces, and manual use of hands and arms, and working both inside a building and outside in all weather conditions.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Three (3) years of full-time work experience, or its part-time equivalent, performing basic building, facility, or ground maintenance tasks. Experience should include general repair, routine upkeep, or practical hands-on maintenance duties in support of a facility, property, or operations environment. Qualifying experience may include assisting a general maintenance worker, handman, facility support staff, or similar role performing everyday repair and upkeep activities.

SPECIAL NECESSARY REQUIREMENT

- When required to operate a motor vehicle, possession of a valid New York State Non-CDL or CDL, including any special endorsements, as required for the type of vehicle being operated.
- Must obtain and maintain security clearance as required by role and TSA regulations
- Subject to Syracuse Regional Airport Authority drug and alcohol testing policy for safety-sensitive positions

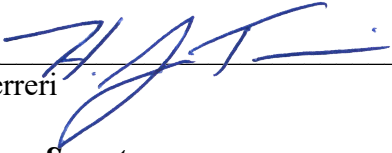

Communications and Community Relations Manager (SRAA)

DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS

The Communications & Community Relations Manager plays a vital role in shaping how the airport engages with its passengers, partners, and surrounding communities. This position blends strategic communications with hands-on program and event leadership to ensure the airport's brand, reputation, and public presence remain strong and forward-looking. From crafting compelling social media stories to strengthening community partnerships, coordinating high-profile events, and enhancing the overall passenger experience, this role serves as a key ambassador for the airport—both inside the terminal and beyond. The position reports to the Chief Commercial Officer.

TYPICAL WORK ACTIVITIES

Communications & Media Relations

- Develop and execute comprehensive communication strategies aligned with the airport's mission and organizational objectives.
- Serve as primary media point of contact, coordinating press releases, interview requests, media briefings, and crisis communications as needed.
- Maintain consistent brand messaging across all platforms and materials.
- Draft speaking points, internal communications, and executive communications as requested.

Social Media & Digital Engagement

- Lead the creation, scheduling, and monitoring of social media content across all channels to drive engagement and promote airport initiatives.
- Collaborate with IT staff to develop, update and maintain website content.
- Develop digital campaigns that highlight airport services, community involvement, operational updates, and passenger enhancements.
- Monitor trends, community sentiment, and analytics to refine messaging and digital strategy.

Community Relations & Outreach

- Manage and grow the airport's Fly Guide and Pets Easing Travelers volunteer programs, ensuring participants receive proper training, recognition, and ongoing engagement.
- Build and maintain relationships with local organizations, schools, nonprofits, businesses, and civic groups to strengthen the airport's community presence.
- Represent the airport at community events, meetings, and public forums.

Event Coordination & Planning

- Plan, coordinate, and execute airport-sponsored events, including community programs, open houses, holiday activities, and special recognition ceremonies.
- Lead planning and execution of inaugural airline events, route launches, and other high-visibility celebrations in partnership with internal teams and airline partners.
- Oversee logistics, vendor coordination, event budgets, and post-event evaluation.

Passenger Experience & Enhancement Initiatives

- Develop and deliver programs focused on improving the customer journey, from terminal activation initiatives to community-driven passenger support activities.
- Collaborate with internal departments on customer service campaigns, amenities upgrades, and engagement opportunities.
- Monitor passenger feedback and help translate insights into actionable improvements.
- Develops and tracks customer service KPI's.

Internal Collaboration & Leadership

- Work closely with airport leadership, operations, marketing, and administrative teams to ensure consistent communication across departments.
- Provide strategic insights regarding public perception, passenger trends, and community expectations.
- Support emergency communications and public information roles within the airport's incident command structure.
- Any other duties as assigned

FULL PERFORMANCE KNOWLEDGES, SKILLS, ABILITIES AND PERSONAL CHARACTERISTICS

Strong knowledge of marketing and communications media and their effective use.

Excellent written communication skills, including clear writing, editing, and proofreading.

Ability to design and develop newsletters and related communication materials.

Effective oral communication and public speaking skills.

Ability to build and maintain positive working relationships with staff, partners, and the public.

Ability to research, verify, and clearly present information.

B. Six (6) years of paraprofessional or professional level work experience, or its part-time equivalent, two (2) years of which must have been professional level work experience in public relations, marketing or communications.

C. An equivalent combination of training and experience as defined by the limits of (A) and (B).

NOTE: Successful completion of graduate semester credit hours in public relations, marketing or communications from a regionally accredited college or university or one accredited by the New

York State Board of Regents to grant degrees may be substituted for work experience as follows:
Thirty (30) graduate semester hours is equivalent to one (1) year of work experience.

WHEREAS, the Board hereby desires to clarify that said publication requirements, as provided in the Bylaws and Resolution No. 26 of 2019, do not apply to Authority job/career postings and/or advertisements;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of the Authority does hereby clarify and affirm that Authority job/career postings and advertisements are not required to be published in the Designated Official Newspaper as set forth in Section 6.5 of the Bylaws and Resolution No. 26 of 2019; and it is further

RESOLVED, that with respect to any Authority job/career postings or advertisements, Authority management, in the exercise of its reasonable business judgment and in the performance of their duties, may post/advertise same in such publications, print or digital media outlets, and/or in such manner as management deems reasonable and appropriate under the circumstances and based upon the target employees sought to be apprised; and it is further

RESOLVED, that Resolution No. 26 of 2019, and hereby clarified, remains in full force and effect.

WHEREAS, the Syracuse Regional Airport Authority (the "**Authority**") is a public benefit corporation, formed and operating pursuant to Chapter 463 of the Laws of New York 2011 (the "**Enabling Act**") and Article 8, Title 34 of the New York Public Authorities Law, as amended; and

WHEREAS, Section 6.5 of the Authority's Bylaws provide that the Board of the Authority may designate a newspaper of general circulation in the Onondaga County area as its official newspaper for the publication of legal notices, requests for proposals or bids, or other official Board or Authority advertisements or publications; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution No.s 19, 20, 21, 22, 23 and 24 of 2011 (the "Additional Publication Resolutions") the Authority previously designated six (6) additional newspapers of general circulation in six (6) additional central New York counties for publication of official Board or Authority advertisements or publications (the "Additional Publications"); and

RESOLVED, that Authority management, in the exercise of its reasonable business judgment and in the performance of their duties, may also publish official Board or Authority advertisements or publications in such other publications, print or digital media outlets as management deems reasonable and appropriate based upon the nature and circumstances surrounding such publication and the target readership sought to be apprised of such publication.

WHEREAS, the Syracuse Regional Airport Authority (the “Authority”) is a public benefit corporation, formed and operating pursuant to Chapter 463 of the Laws of New York 2011 and Article 8, Title 34 of the New York Public Authorities Law, as amended (the “Enabling Act”); and

WHEREAS, the Enabling Act authorizes the Authority to enter into agreements in furtherance of the accomplishment of its corporate purposes, and to appoint such officers, employees and agents as the Authority may require for the performance of its duties, and to fix and determine their qualifications, duties and compensation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority finds and determines the Memorandum of Agreement set forth as an attachment to this Resolution, establishing terms and conditions of employment pursuant to a one (1) year Collective Bargaining Agreement, from July 1, 2026 to June 30, 2027, to be in the best interests of the Authority; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has informed AFSCME Local 1773A that upon approval of the Memorandum of Agreement by both parties it would become effective July 1, 2026;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of the Syracuse Regional Airport Authority hereby authorizes the Executive Director, on behalf of the Authority, to enter into a one (1) year Collective Bargaining Agreement with AFSCME Local 1773A upon such terms and conditions as set forth in the Memorandum of Agreement attached to this Resolution and on such other terms and conditions as the Executive Director, after consultation with counsel, deems in the best interests of the Authority.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

Made this 5th day of February, 2026 by and between Syracuse Regional Airport Authority (hereinafter referred to as "the SRAA") and Council 66 and its affiliate Local Union 1773A of the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees AFL-CIO (hereinafter referred to as "the Union").

The SRAA and the Union agree to extend their 2023-2026 Collective Bargaining Agreement for one year to June 30, 2027, upon the following modifications:

1. Hourly wage rates for the extended (fourth) year of the Collective Bargaining Agreement will be increased by four percent (4%) effective July 1, 2026.
2. Employee health insurance contributions during the fourth year of the Collective Bargaining Agreement will remain at the existing contribution amounts in effect for the July 1, 2025 to June 30, 2026 period.
3. Article 33 of the 2023-2026 Collective Bargaining Agreement will be amended to state that the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect until the 30th day of June 2027. All other terms and conditions of employment as set forth in the 2023-2026 Collective Bargaining Agreement will be carried forward without change.
4. This Memorandum of Agreement is subject to ratification both by members of the Local 1773A bargaining unit and by voting members of the SRAA.

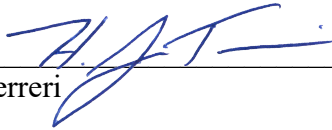

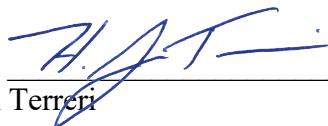
